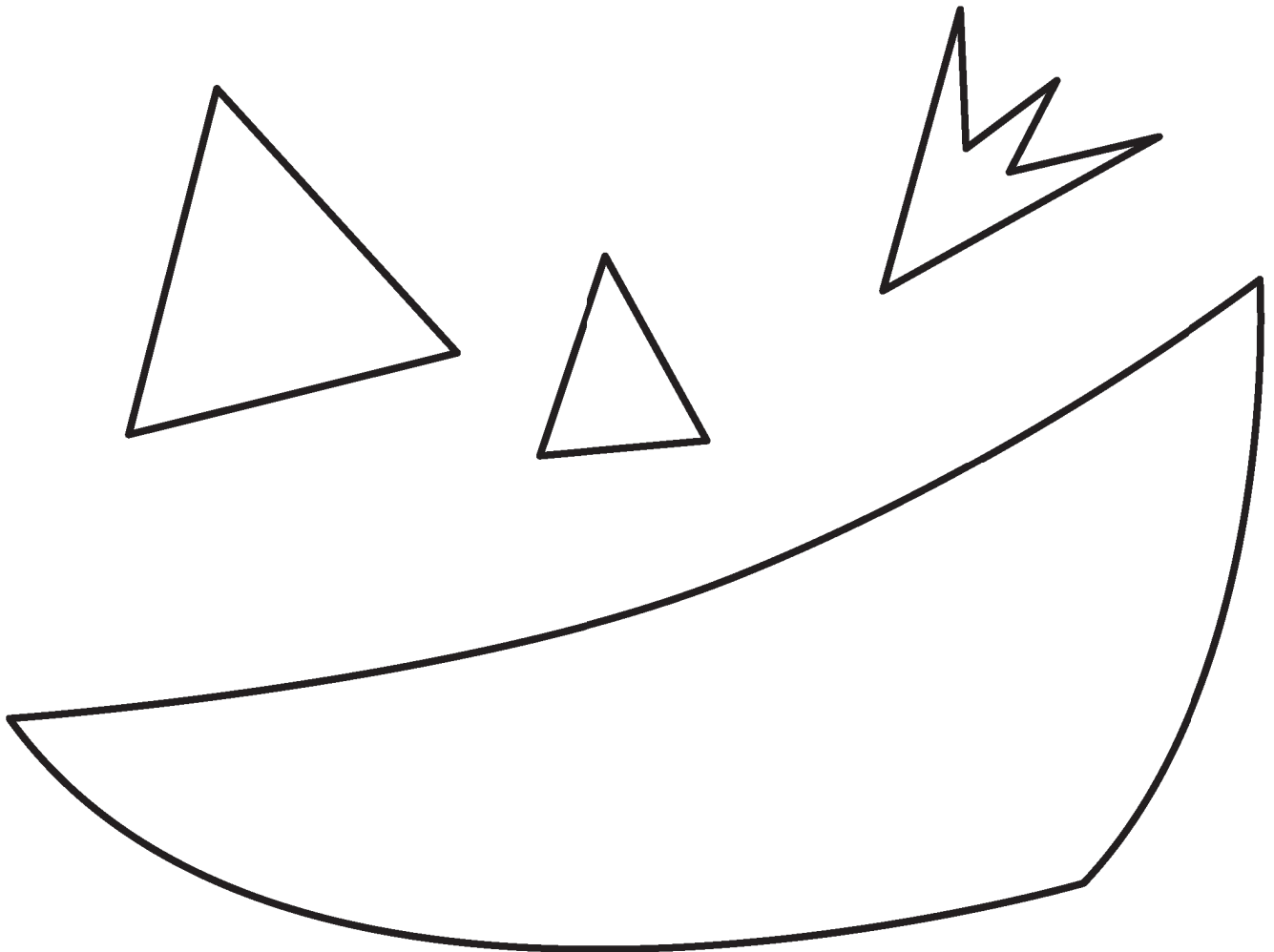


How to carve your Pumpkin



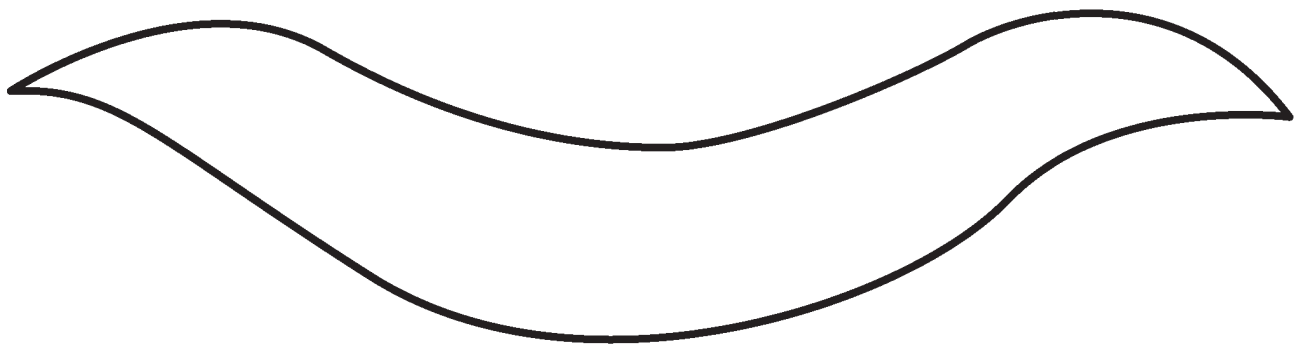
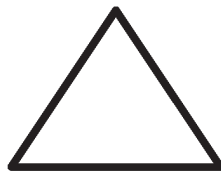
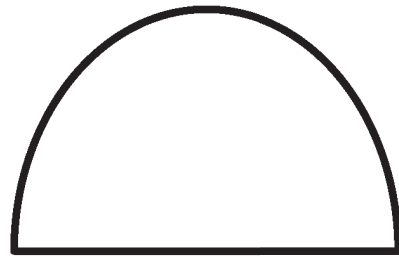
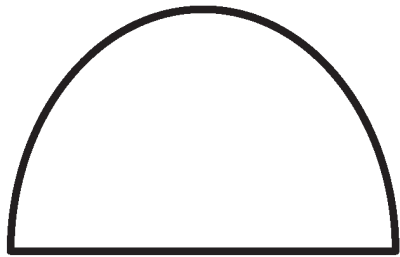
1. Cut a hole at the top of your pumpkin with paring knife and scoop out flesh

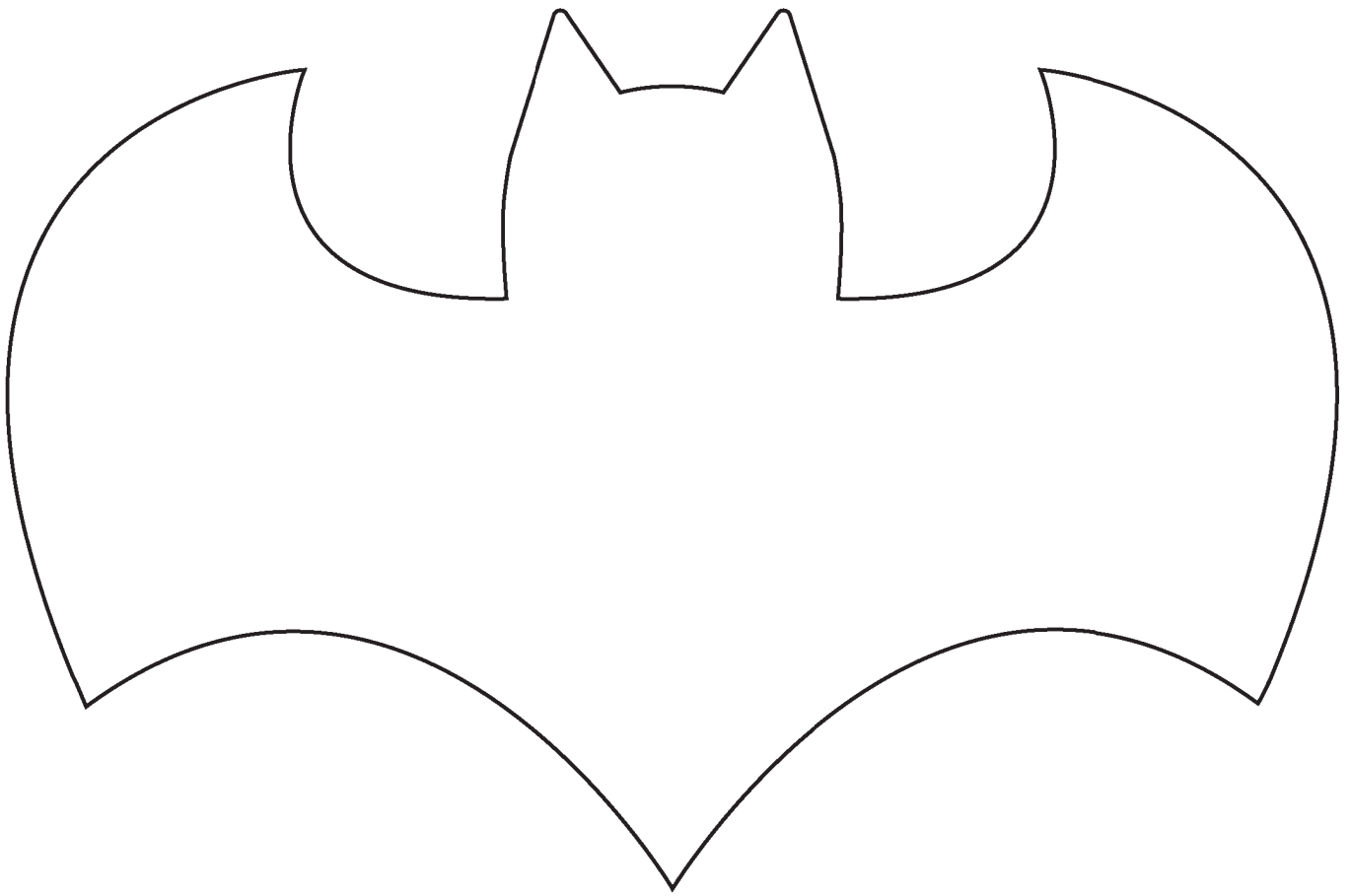

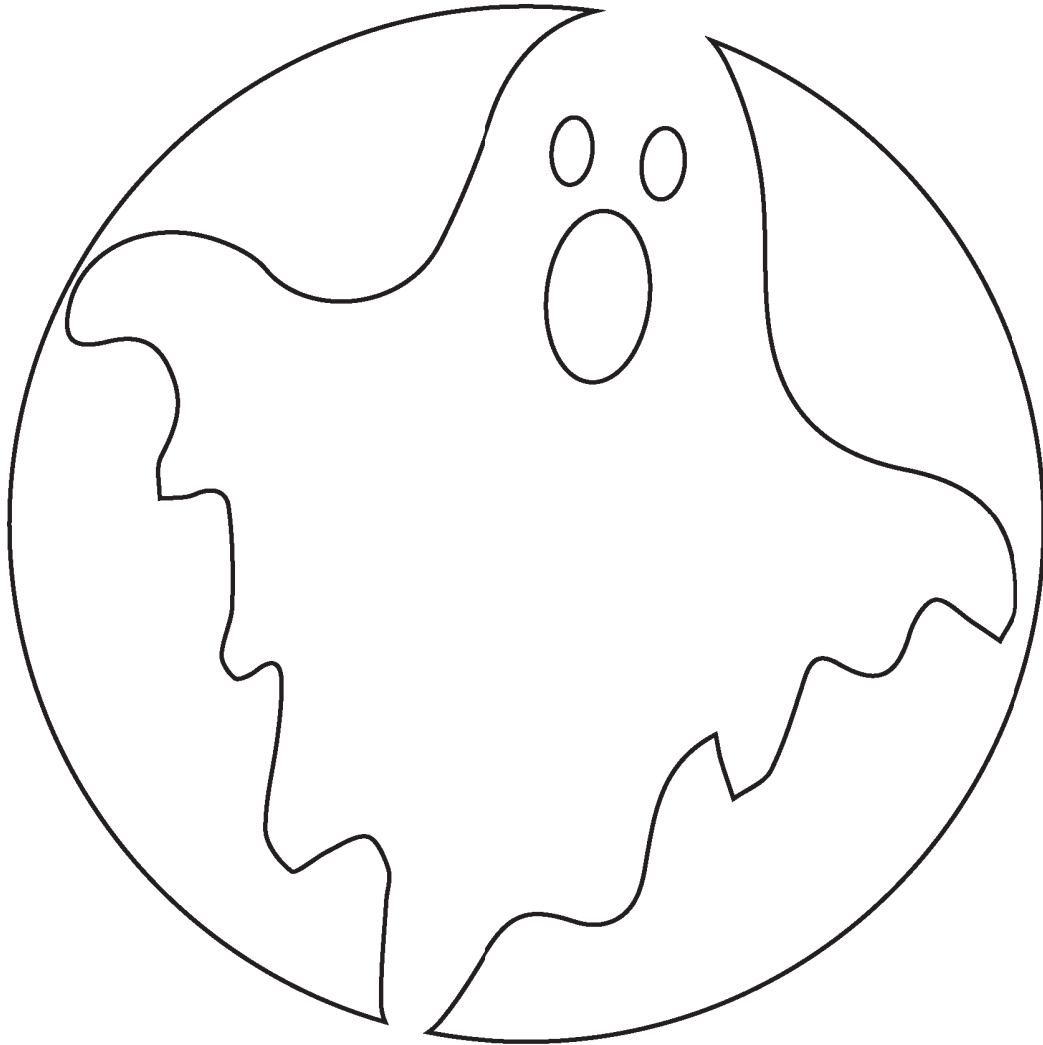
