
How to carve your umpkin


- 1. Cut a hole at the top of your pumpkin with paring knife and scoop out flesh
- 2. Once your pumkin is hollow, secure stencil firmly with tape
- 3. Trace the outline of the stencil by poking holes into the pumpkin using a sharp metal skewer
- 4. Remove the stencil and carve along pattern using a paring knife
- 5. Insert tea light candles

SAFETY: Ensure carving takes place on a flat, dry surface. Always take care when handling knives.






